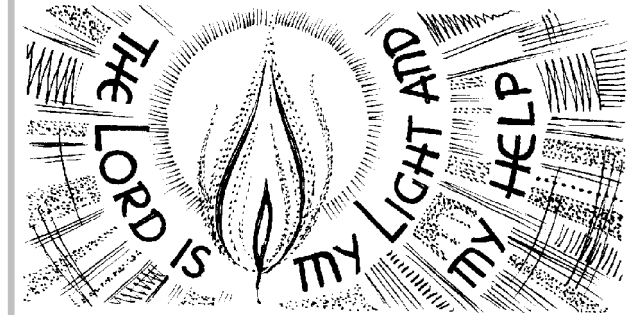

On second & third Sundays—shorter contemporary service with hymns & sermon followed by drinks & chat

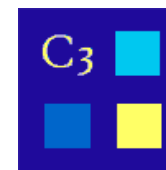
10am Worship 4 All
